Youth Enlightenment Seminars

- The Y.E.S. Tour also known as the "Youth Enlightenment Seminar" began in 1978.
- The Y.E.S. Tour is open to all High Schools in both Suffolk and Nassau County and is scheduled on a first come first serve basis.

How do Schools sign up?

- Every September, the Sunday evening of Labor Day Weekend all schools must sign up for the tour at exactly 12:00AM and will be placed on a list on a first come first serve basis.
- Each school district is allowed to book up to four tours of 40 students.



- The Y.E.S. Tours are held at the Riverhead Facility Monday-Thursday & at the Yaphank Correctional Facility on Fridays.
- When students leave the Y.E.S Tour they have a better understanding on what life behind the bars is like as well as how one bad choice can change your life forever

McGruff the Crime Dog





McGruff the Crime Dog

- McGruff the Crime Dog is offered to children in grades 1st 3rd.
- McGruff covers bullying, stranger danger, knowing your address, and parents/guardians phone numbers.
- The program runs for 3 consecutive weeks: one day per week for 30 minutes. The program is taught by an officer and finishes with a visit from McGruff the Crime Dog. Certificates are given out to all participants.

The Suffolk County Sheriff's Office offers a college internship program for students who have a strong interest in law enforcement and/or are currently enrolled in criminal justice courses.




The program is designed to give an in-depth working view of the Sheriff's Office, offering a broad spectrum of work areas which contain different aspects of law, both criminal and civil.

The program runs during the spring, summer, and fall semesters. Spring and fall semesters run for 16-weeks and the summer semester runs for 13-weeks.



- Over the course of 5 years the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office has had 237 interns complete the program
- A survey was sent out to all former interns and 87% of interns are currently working in Law Enforcement

Operation Safe Child

- Officers from the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office photograph and fingerprint children and submit their information to the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services (AMBER ALERT.)
- Parents are issued ID cards to keep for their children.
- This card contains critical information to aid in the search of a child should they go missing.



Senior Medical ID Card





Senior Medical ID Card

- The Suffolk County Sheriff's Office is the only agency in Suffolk County that offers this program.
- This program places seniors' medical information on a small card the size of a credit card so that they can carry it on them in case of emergency.

- Shed the Meds is a safe way to dispose of unwanted or expired medication.
- We do not accept pharmacy, commercial or doctor's office medication disposal.
- No liquids or sharp items accepted.
